The Hasbro Children's Hospital of Rhode Island Hospital and the Alpert Medical School of Brown University Department of Pediatrics is seeking an experienced academic leader to join us as the **Division Director of General Pediatrics and Public Health**. The Division Director is expected to oversee and expand programs to deliver state-of-the-art pediatric care, teaching, research and advocacy, to pursue her/his/their own research program, and to promote the academic career development of faculty and trainees. The Division Director reports directly to the Department Chair. The successful candidate will participate in the clinical and teaching activities of the division and department, with protected time for administrative responsibilities. The Division Director will lead the academic pediatric faculty working at the Hasbro Primary Care Center.

Requirements

Minimum requirements include an MD, DO or foreign equivalent degree, eligibility for medical licensure in the state of Rhode Island, and certification by the American Board of Pediatrics.

We seek a dynamic candidate with vision for the field of General Academic Pediatrics and the ability to: develop junior faculty and residents into future leaders in pediatrics, collaborate with colleagues, administration and our community to manage primary care workflow and promote population health, and oversee academic infrastructure for the division. Successful candidates will have demonstrated ability in administration, excellence in patient care and teaching, a track record of scholarship and national recognition in their field, and ideally be eligible for appointment as Associate or Full Professor.

The Division of General Pediatrics and Public Health.

Hasbro Primary Care serves a diverse patient population and close to 90% of our patients receive Medicaid. We are a National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) recognized Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH). Embedded in our clinic are smaller primary care specialty clinics caring for refugee families, children with chronic medical conditions, children in the Foster Care system, mothers who are teenagers and their children, and our HEALTH clinic that cares for children with obesity. In support of the clinic's mission we have a full-time, embedded social worker, a hospital-supported Connect for Health initiative, interpreters, and a PCMH supported care coordinator.

Division faculty staff the sole continuity clinic site for our 48 categorical and 15 Triple Board residents. The clinic serves close to 10,000 patients, mostly from Rhode Island. The clinic is also a primary training site for medical students from the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University. The qualified pediatrician will, therefore, be a dedicated and passionate educator with experience in an academic practice.
